Main Policies:

- Dogs must be for adopter's household only, not a gift.
- Dogs must be kept inside when no one is home.
- Adoptions are a lifetime commitment.

Veterinary Care:

Dogs receive the following vet care prior to adoption:

- Exam(s)
- Age-appropriate vaccinations
- Treatment for worms, fleas etc.
- Care for injuries or illnesses, as needed

Spay/Neuter (S/N):

- Dogs/puppies over 6 months of age are S/N prior to adoption
- We determine when to S/N animals based on: age, weight, and various health factors to ensure surgery is performed safely

Please make sure you are ready for this ay mean making accommodations in your life to ensure your dog is happy and healthy and will st of your dog's life.

should be treated as a member of your family.

Reason: We want to ensure that your current housing allows dogs so you are not evicted or asked to give up your dog. And that you are committed to accommodating your dog if you move in the future.

2. Spaying/Neutering. Dogs will not be adopted into homes with unneutered cats/dogs. We will verify with current vet records for your current animals. All adult dogs over 6 months of age are spayed/neutered before adoption. We determine when to spay/neuter based on: 1) age, 2) weight, and 3) various health factors to ensure surgery is performed safely. Younger puppies not spayed/neutered before adoption must be spayed/neutered by the adopter at approximately 6 months of age at your expense. Note: We will verify post-adoption that all dogs have been spayed/neutered. We enforce any breach in our contract by imposing a \$300 fine and may take other actions to enforce the terms of our contract.

Reason: Virginia law requires all cats/dogs adopted from animal welfare organizations be spayed/neutered. Each year, millions of cats/dogs are needlessly euthanized because there are too many of them and too few responsible homes to care for them. There are also significant health and behavioral benefits to spaying/neutering (e.g., reduced risk of certain cancers, elimination of spraying urine)

3. <u>Children</u>. If you have a child under approximately 6 years of age, we will not place a puppy under 6 months of age in your household. The appropriate age for adopting a puppy into a home with children will depend on the age of the child as well as the personality and the needs of the puppy.

Reason: Younger puppies are more fragile and can be accidentally injured by a small child. Also, young puppies tend to jump and use their teeth during play, which can harm younger children. Children and pets make wonderful companions for one another when supervised and matched appropriately.

- **8.** <u>Costs of Care</u>. A single dog that is already spayed/neutered will cost at least \$500 per year in food, litter, other supplies and basic vet care. This does not include any health-related illnesses or emergencies. Your dog will need an annual checkup and age-appropriate vaccinations. All dogs require regular vet care. You are responsible for providing vet care and paying all vet bills once you adopt. **Reason:** Annual exams and vaccinations protect your dog from health issues and diseases which can be fatal. Rabies shots are required by law to prevent your dog from contracting rabies and passing it on to humans if your dog accidentally comes into contact with a rabid animal.
- 9. <u>Lifetime Commitment</u>. Adopting a dog is a lifetime commitment. Please contact us if there are significant incompatibility issues or if you have an urgent situation and cannot continue caring for your dog. We will do everything we can to help you resolve your situation such as providing advice, helping you find a new home for your dog, or taking your dog back into our care at our discretion. **Reason:** We want our dogs to be cared for all their lives. We will do everything that is reasonably possible to help ensure this happens.
- **10.** <u>Home Visit</u>. We reserve the right to visit your home any time after the adoption to make sure you and the dog are happy and to verify the terms of the contract are being followed. If any condition of the Adoption Contract has been violated, or if it is the opinion of Second Chance Animal Rescue VA that the environment is unsafe, we reserve the right to take actions to remove the dog from the home. We do pre-adoption home visits for all animals.
